## I Will Always Be A Republican

In a recent television interview with CNN's Candy Crowley, Rand Paul was asked if he would ever consider leaving the Republican Party and joining another Party, even the Democrat Party. Rand Paul laughed and responded, "No. I've always been a Republican and I am one of those people who is actually a real lover of the history of the Republican Party – from the days of abolition to the days of civil rights." He then talked about how Republicans in his home state of Kentucky fought the "Democrat Jim Crow" laws, and goes on to conclude, "So I am proud to be a Republican and couldn't imagine being anything else."

By just doing a simple review of American history, one can see that Rand Paul is right.

In the 1850's, the Democratic controlled congress passed the Fugitive Slave Law, and the Kansas Nebraska Act. Following these pro-slavery laws, some anti-slavery Democrats along with anti-slavery members from other political parties formed a new political party to fight against slavery, called the Republican Party. In 1860, the first Republican President was elected in Abraham Lincoln, as well as a majority of Republicans in congress.

The Republican congress immediately began to pass civil rights laws including equal pay for those in the military. Shortly after the Civil War, they passed the 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendments - abolishing slavery, giving human rights to former slaves, and the right to vote for former slaves respectively. The 15th Amendment was passed without a single Democrat vote in congress. The Republi-

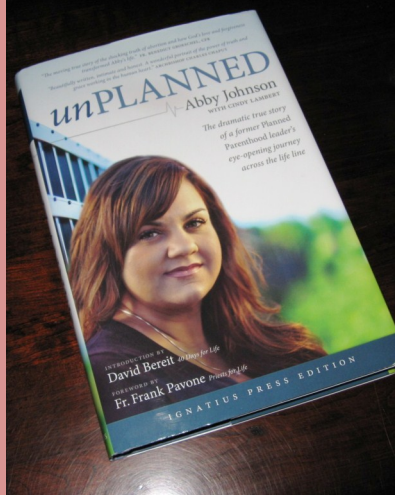

The Ascension Republican Women meet on the third Thursday of each month at 12:00 Noon at various local restaurants.

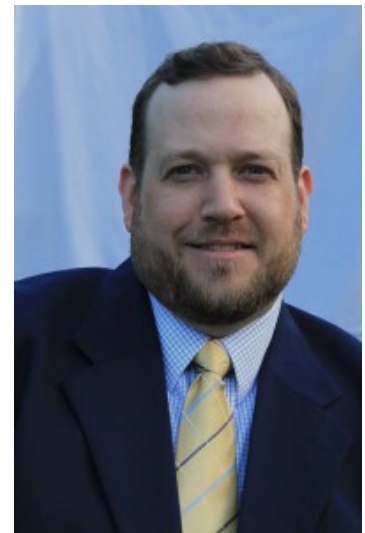

can congress went on to pass 23 civil rights bills, until the Democrats took control of congress in 1876. Once the Democrats took control of the Congress again, there was not another civil rights bill passed for nearly nine decades.



Even with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, there was opposition by the Democrats. Even though they had an overwhelming majority at the time (72% of the Congress), out of the 315 Democrats, only 198 (62%) voted for the bill. 83% of the Republicans voted for it, and it was also the Republican President Eisenhower who originally tried to pass civil rights legislation that was either blocked or watered down by the Democrats. The Democrats finally saw "the handwriting on the wall," so they decided, for purely political reasons, to end their fight against civil rights, and to try to make it look like they were on the right side of the "poor" all along. Today, the national Democratic Party continues their rich history of their anti-American, anti-human rights, and anti-Christian agenda, and it is the Republican

Party who is still fighting the Democrats on these types of issues, especially on the most basic human right to life of the unborn. Why is it today that the Republican Party is seen as the anti-civil rights Party by some? Well, as Winston Churchill once said, "A lie gets halfway around the world before the truth has a chance to get its pants on." The prophet Isaiah said, "Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil; who substitute darkness for light and light for darkness." Kudos to Rand Paul for entering the "Lions den," for recognizing the light and the darkness, and for verbalizing it with such wisdom.

Covington and is currently employed in the utility industry.

Mr. Maness is running for the Senate out of frustration over how the President has worked to dismantle the Constitution of the United States, with Senator Landrieu supporting that agenda.
